- 5. NATO in shaping the international security environment by 2025.
- 6. NATO's strategic concepts, the military systems of NATO countries, and national military policy and strategy.
- 7. A strategic concept for the development and operational use of NATO forces in the coming years.
- 8. Military and social conflicts of the first half of the XXI century.

Classes:

- 1. Basic conceptual categories related to the concepts of security and NATO.
- 2. Modern security environment.
- 3. NATO in shaping global security.

Others:

1. Term paper: Critical analysis of a selected from the proposed list of literature in the NATO area in shaping the international security environment. Selected problems of NATO's activity in the contemporary security environment. Summary and completion of classes.
